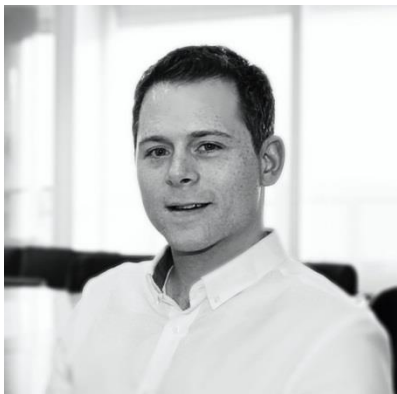
Patrick Andrews – Author, business adviser and former Head of Governance, Riversimple
